# A Pyramid in Arizona

Believe it or not, there is a pyramid in the United States. Yes, it's in Arizona. Not far from the naked bookstore owner is the burial site of Hadji Ali, aka "Hi Jolly," topped with a pyramid.

Hadji Ali, the lead camel driver for the U.S. Army's Camel Corps in the mid-1800s, was commissioned to drive the Army's camels, imported from the Middle East, across the southwestern United States. The U.S. Army's Camel Corps experiment was not successful, but Hadji Ali decided to remain in Arizona. The camels stayed, too.

Hadji Ali married and became a successful businessman. He was so well-loved by the citizens of Quartzsite that they built a beautiful quartz pyramid for his tomb when he died in 1902.

About 50 years after his death, the military decided to honor Hadji Ali's service to the U.S. by attaching a commemorative plaque to the pyramid. Better late than never, the usual modus operandi of the U.S. government.

Pay homage to Hadji Ali at his pyramid on West Main Street near Business 10, a few miles down the road from the bookstore.
