Luling Council rejects dam restoration bids

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LULING — In a unanimous vote, the City Council decided to throw out bids received for the Zedler Mill Dam Rehabilitation and Bank Reclamation during a special meeting held Thursday.

The board sided with the recommendation presented by engineering firm Freese and Nichols to discard the three bids received for the Dam Rehabilitation and Bank Reclamation project. Freese and Nichols' Les Boyd recommended rebidding the dam rehabilitation, and bank reclamation as separate projects.

After reviewing all options, the board agreed.

On behalf of the Luling Airport Advisory Board, John Westbrook recommended an Airport Land/Building Lease between Skydive Midwest and the City of Luling. He stated the new lease agreements are about 90-95% completed, setting fees, lease of land, and activities.

The Advisory Board is looking into adding fuel storage cells, and patching and sealing the runway.

In other items, the City Council also approved the application for tax abatement for a 55-room La Quinta to be built on 2.68 acres to the east of Edna's Diner.

Date for a public hearing regarding the designation of a reinvestment zone was set for February 13 at 5:30 p.m.
